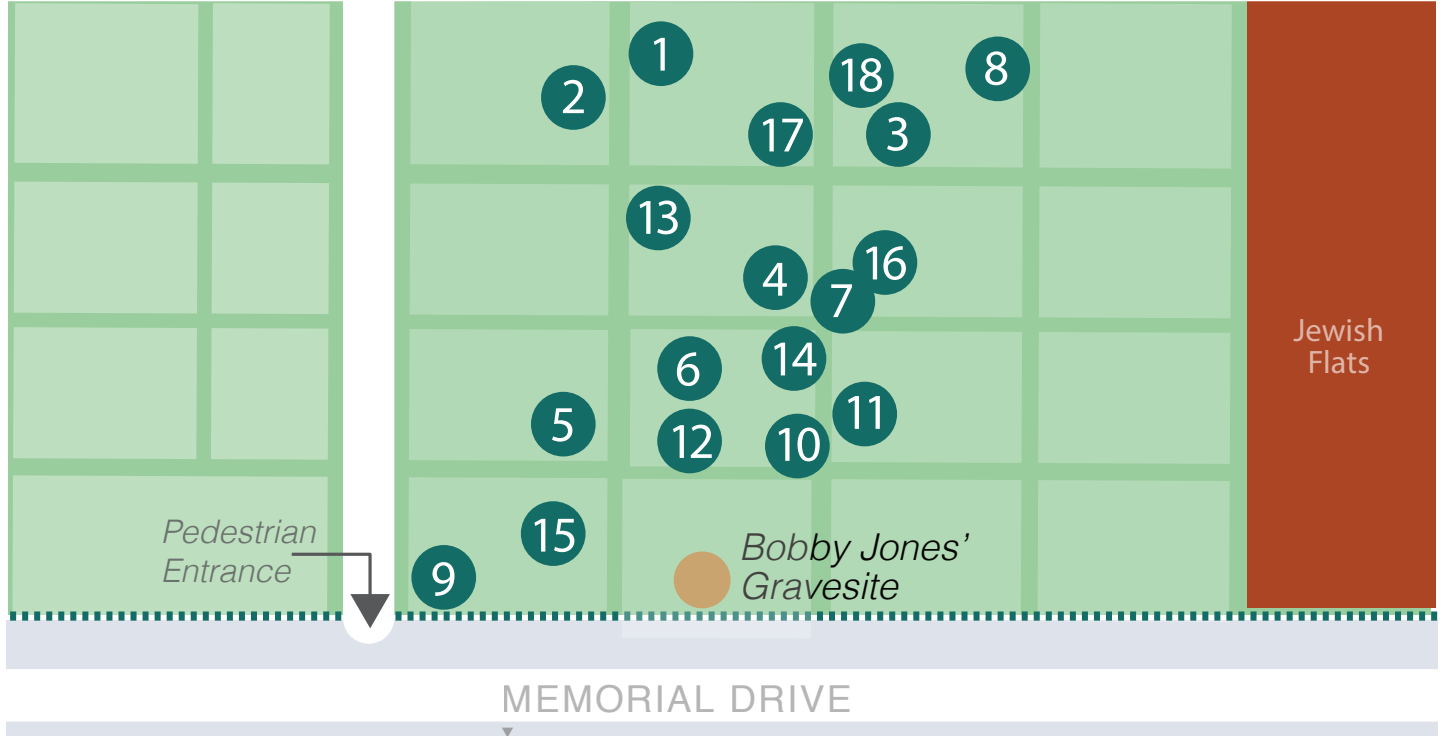


Confederate Memorial Grounds



18 Plants of Augusta National at Oakland Cemetery

The area just inside the Memorial Drive pedestrian gate is commonly referred to as the “Bobby Jones area,” a tribute to its most well-known resident. Bobby Jones founded the Augusta National Golf Club on the former Fruitland Nursery property. The course design was inspired by the nursery and its collection of southern trees, shrubs, and flowers. Each hole has a “signature” plant that it is named for.

In restoring the Bobby Jones area, we have incorporated the 18 signature plants into the landscape so that you can experience a bit of Augusta National when you come to Oakland. While nothing can compare to the Masters experience, why not imagine yourself walking the course while you wander around the cemetery? Bring your own pimento cheese sandwich.
